




TANNER/SIU/ELLIOTT: BOY WITH GOLDFISH


KORNGOLD: KINGS ROW

This Toronto band has been playing their unique blend of New Orleans traditional style jazz since 1971. They have performed for such notables as the

Queen Mother, President Ford and Prime Minister Trudeau, and have been invited to play in New Orleans at the annual jazz and Heritage Festival for six consecutive years. The album contains a total of eight cuts in a variety of moods from easy listening to "hot jazz", march time and Latin beat.
